OSCAR HAMMERSTEIN II (*Lyrics*) was an American lyricist, librettist, theatrical producer, and musical theatre director from New York City. He won a total of 8 Tony Awards for his best known works, *South Pacific* (1949), *The King and I* (1951), and *The Sound of Music* (1959). He twice won the Academy Award for Best Original Song, for his songs "The Last Time I Saw Paris" (1940) and "It Might as Well Be Spring" (1945). Several of his songs became part of the standard repertoire for both singers and jazz musicians. During the 1940s and the 1950s, Hammerstein produced some of his best musicals in collaboration with the composer Richard Rodgers (1902-1979). They are credited with creating character-driven stories with dramatic moments, while American musicals were previously considered lighthearted entertainment.

HOWARD LINDSAY & RUSSEL CROUSE (Book) Lindsay and Crouse's partnership stands today as the longest collaboration of any writers in theatrical history, lasting for more than 28 years. The two men first joined forces in 1934, when the producer Vinton Freedley brought them together to rewrite the libretto for *Anything Goes*, which Lindsay directed. Two years later, they wrote another Cole Porter show, *Red, Hot and Blue*. Their first straight play, Life with Father, opened in 1936 and holds the record for the longest running play on Broadway, at 3,224 performances. Lindsay and his wife, Dorothy Stickney, created the roles of Clarence and Vinnie Day, performing them for five years. Among other shows, Lindsay and Crouse also wrote *The Sound of Music* (score by Rodgers and Hammerstein); the Pulitzer Prize winning State of the Union; *Call me Madam* and *Mr. President* (scores by Irving Berlin); The Prescott Proposals and The Great Sebastians. They produced The Hasty Heart, Detective Story and Arsenic and Old Lace. Howard Lindsay (1889-1968) was an actor, stage manager, director and playwright before teaming up with Russel Crouse. Russel Crouse (1893-1966) was a newspaperman, a press agent for the Theatre Guild, the author of several books and a librettist before partnering with Howard Lindsay. Crouse later reproduced, in collaboration with his wife, Anna Erskine Crouse, a son, the writer Timothy Crouse, and a daughter, the actress Lindsay Crouse.

RICHARD RODGERS (*Music*) contribution to the musical theatre of his day was extraordinary, and his influence on the musical theatre of today and tomorrow is legendary. His career spanned more than six decades, his hits ranging from the silver screens of Hollywood to the bright lights of Broadway, London and beyond. He was the recipient of countless awards, including Pulitzers, Tonys, Oscars, Grammys and Emmys. He wrote more than 900 published songs and 40 Broadway musicals.



MARIA AUGUSTA TRAPP (*The Trapp Family Singers*) originally studied to become a nun before her marriage to Baron Georg von Trapp in 1927. The family, which grew to include 10 children, began performing as the Trapp Family Choir in the mid-1930s, and then the Trapp Family Singers after moving to the United States later in the decade. In 1949, the Baroness wrote the memoir *The Story of the Trapp Family Singers*, which became the inspiration for the 1959 musical *The Sound of Music* and the 1965 film of the same name.

MARK FLEISCHER (*Executive Producer*) serves as the artistic and administrative head of the Pittsburgh CLO producing the company's 6-show summer season, Kara Cabaret Series and its annual production of A Musical Christmas Carol. Mark's passion for developing new musicals led to the creation of CLO's SPARK Festival initiative to develop new small musicals – a program made possible by the CLO's Next Generation Capital Campaign. Since its creation in 2017, the program has contributed to the development of more than 15 new musicals including the world premieres of *Up and Away* by Kevin Hammonds and Kristin Bair, Game On by Marcus Stevens and David Dabbon, Beyond the Moon by Joe Domencic and Christina McCann, The Double-Threat Trio by Adam Overett and An Untitled New Play by Justin Timberlake (co-produced by Pittsburgh's City Theatre). SPARK has also led to the adaptation and reduction of reducing existing Broadway shows so they can be produced with smaller casts (*First Date, Xanadu*, and *Dirty Rotten Scoundrels*). Prior to joining the CLO, Mark was the Producing Artistic Director of Adirondack Theatre Festival from 2007 – 2014 where he was named the Region's Best Artistic Director by Metroland in 2009. From 1993 – 2002 he served as the Managing Artistic Director of Plano Repertory Theatre in suburban Dallas from 1993 – 2002. With a passion for new plays and musicals, he has directed readings

and world premiere productions for theatres across the country. He is a Board Member of the National Alliance for Musical Theatre (NAMT), chairing the organization's Educational Resources Committee and has served on its New Musical Festival Committee. Mark is also a member of The Broadway League where he serves on the Intra-Industry committee. He has taught acting, theatre history and arts administration courses at SUNY Empire State College, Columbia College, and Collin College. Mark holds a BA in English Literature and Communication Arts from Austin College and MFA in Directing from the Theatre School at DePaul University.

PITTSBURGH CLO (*Producing Company*) has been a driving force behind the preservation, creation and promotion of live musical theater since 1946. Founded in the years following WWII as a way to bring Pittsburgh together for a community experience, the company has grown to become one of the largest regional musical theater organizations in the country. CLO produces fresh new productions of Broadway classics, as well as its ongoing commitment to develop new musicals of all sizes. The organization's dedication to musical theater extends beyond its six-show summer season at the Benedum Center to year-round programming at the 250-seat Cabaret Theater which saw the world premieres of Judge Jackie: Disorder in the Court by Michael Kooman and Christopher Diamond (2014), Up and Away by Kevin Hammonds and Kristin Bair (2018), Game On by David Dabbon and Marcus Stevens (2018) and The Double-Threat Trio by Adam Overett (2019), as well as the musical An Untitled New Play by Justin Timberlake by Matt Schattz (2021 co-production with City Theatre). To support the development of these small cast musicals the CLO launched the SPARK Festival in 2018 which has developed over 15 new musicals through readings, workshops, and world premiere productions. The company's Gallery of Heroes program has commissioned and produced over 25 world premiere educational musicals designed for in-school presentations integrating musical theatre and classroom science/social studies curriculum. Gallery of Heroes performs in over 100 schools annually. The current GOH show in development about Civil rights icon John Lewis is titled Hero: The Boy from Troy by Nambi E. Kelley and Joe Plummer. Outside of Pittsburgh the organization has helped grow the art form through its involvement with 28 Broadway shows (30 Tony Awards®) and in 2014 produced the world premiere of An American in Paris on Broadway, where it won 4 Tony Awards[®] and was the most awarded musical of the 2015 season, and in London's West End. In addition, the company has a commitment to nurturing emerging talent and has been credited with launching the careers of numerous artists such as Billy Porter, Renée Elise Goldsberry, Rob Marshall, Kathleen Marshall, Rob Ashford, Bernadette Peters and Shirley Jones. CLO's extensive education efforts include a university internship program, New Horizons for students with disabilities, and Creative Vision an in-school residency program at underperforming schools. Other ongoing initiatives include the Pittsburgh CLO Academy of Musical Theater, the Construction Center for the Arts, the acclaimed Gene Kelly Awards for Excellence in High School Musical Theater, and the National high School Musical Theatre Awards (The Jimmys) created in partnership with the Nederlander Organization and The Broadway League.
