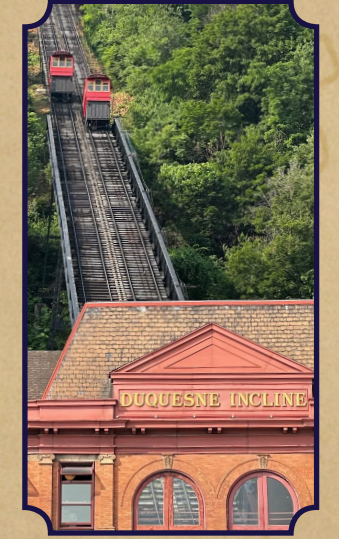

WASHINGTON'S LANDING
When Washington fell off his raft into the icy Allegheny on Dec. 28, 1753, he took refuge near here.

**POINT STATE PARK/
FORT PITT MUSEUM/
FOUNTAIN**
The location of the original French fort (Fort Duquesne) and its successor (the British Fort Pitt).



DUQUESNE INCLINE
The Duquesne Incline is one of several landmarks whose name reminds us of the French occupation of this area.



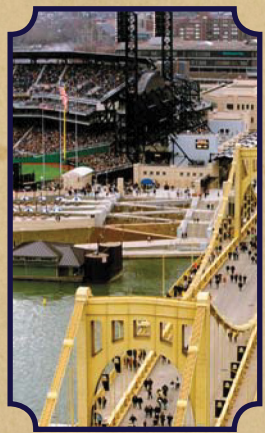
GRANDVIEW AVE/MT. WASHINGTON
Washington stood near what is now the flag pole along Grandview Avenue on Mount Washington in 1754 and wrote in his journal:
"I spent some time in viewing the Rivers, and the Land in the Fork; which I think extremely well situated for a Fort, as it has the absolute Command of both Rivers."



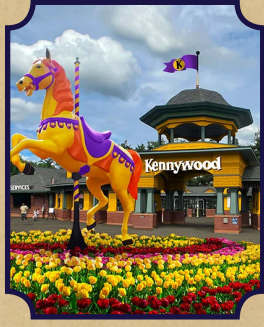
A. ALLEGHENY RIVER
In the Delaware language, Allegheny means "stream of the Allegewi."

B. MON RIVER
In the Delaware language, Monongahela means "river of falling banks."

C. OHIO RIVER
In the Iroquois language, Ohio means "great."



KENNYWOOD PARK
Braddock crossed the Monongahela in 1755 near the present Homestead Highlevel Bridge by Kennywood Park, nearby Fort Duquesne.



NORTH BRADDOCK
A statue of Washington stands on Jones Street in North Braddock, where GW accompanied General Braddock on a campaign that led to a defeat of the British. The center of the battlefield is now occupied by the Little League field behind the statue.



FORT NECESSITY
Braddock died near the site of Fort Necessity and was buried in the road to conceal his grave.

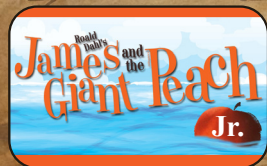
